Well, we better settle down because someone might get preachy. If you don't. If you don't do that, praise God. Well, if you have your Bible like Joe Morris said, just turn to where you think. Let's see if you're flowing. You can go to Isaiah 40, if you will. We're ready to go. Okay. Well. Good evening. Welcome. On this Wednesday Wednesday afternoon Gracelife church. Glad to see all the smile on the faces that's here tonight. Praise God. Glad that you're joining us here tonight. Uh, we're going to give this a title for whatever reason. And I just love it because no one knows my title except Elliot. Just a few minutes for service, and I just. I told them, I told my wife, I says, I said, see these songs we're singing. I said, yeah, I said, watch the message. When we don't talk no more. Confinement is no more confinement. Confinement in your life. No more confinement. Yes. Now, the way this started for me this morning was I didn't have I didn't have a message called no more confinement. I wasn't thinking about no more confinement. I was sitting on my desk and he said. He said, get your phone or dictionary out and look up three words. And, uh. And one of the words I looked up, I've never looked up.

Ever. And it's the word define. Usually go to the dictionary to define something, he told me. He looked up the word define. So anyway, we'll get to that in just a moment. But Isaiah chapter 40 and I and I'm in the am PC that's amplified classic. You see. Well I don't like that one. We'll just like it for just a minute or I'll get out of it and then you'll be okay. But Isaiah 40 verse one in the amplified classic says, comfort, comfort. My people says, comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to the heart of Jerusalem, and cry to her that her time of service and her warfare are ended, and that her punishment is accepted in her iniquity, is pardoned, and that she has received punishment from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. Now, a little history. I should have said this before. Uh, Isaiah speaking prophetically of the Messiah that's coming. Jesus is not here, but he's speaking prophetically, you know, of the coming Messiah, and he's telling him and he's telling them. He says, here's what you need to know. The Messiah is coming. So comfort, comfort not fear, fear, but comfort, comfort. And he says, uh, he says to his people, speak tenderly to the heart of Jerusalem, and cry to her that her time of service and her warfare are ended.

That her punishment, her because of their sins, is accepted in her iniquity, is pardoned. Don't you just love it? God has a prophet speak, and he says, comfort, comfort, peace, peace, joy, joy. Your sins have been pardoned and Messiah's not even been born on the earth yet. Wow. I think the Lord's ahead of us just a little bit, don't you? Now, I've been studying a little bit, and I've come to this conclusion not ready to quite preach it yet. So don't take me real serious about this, but it looks like he knows the future. He might know just about everything. I know that I was kind of out there, so y'all don't. I might get some cards and letters in the mail. That's a bad joke, right? Well, he says, your punishment is accepted and her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received punishment from the Lord's hand. Double. Jesus didn't just pay for your sins, he at least doubled it says the Lord's hand double for all her sins. Verse three. A voice of one who cries, prepare in the wilderness the way of the Lord. Clear away the obstacles. You don't know what obstacles are. You won't ever had an obstacle in their way. Don't, don't, don't, don't you know.

Don't give any names. Clear away the obstacles. Make straight and smooth in the desert a highway for our God. Well, what do you build a highway for? Travel on it. Are. And I guess, you know, if you had if you if you was a hanger for an airplane, you'd have to have a long highway, wouldn't you? Because something's about to land. Verse four. Every valley shall be lifted and filled up, and every mountain and hill shall be made low. And the crooked and the uneven shall be made straight and level. And every rough places a plain. So if you have any places that need to be cleared away with the obstacles, here's good news. The Lord says, get ready for smooth and straight. Amen. Get ready, he says. He said, go ahead and put a highway out. I'm ready to land. He said all those, all those places, he says they're going to be lifted and filled up all the gaps. Every mountain hill shall be made low, he said. All the crooked and uneven places. I'm going to make them straight and I'm going to revel. I'm going to level the rough places like the plane. I'm just reading the Bible, so don't get too excited now. It's just the Bible, verse five, and the glory, here it is.

And the glory. The majesty and splendor of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken it. Well, we could take that to the bank and spend it coming, because the mouth of the Lord is spoken. Now here's the three words, and here's the order that I got them and had no idea what I was going to minister tonight. This early this morning, I was sitting in my office and he said, look up these three words. And I said, okay, well, here we go. I just love it when it works this way. He said, look up the word confined and confinement. So I looked it up and if I can, I'm going to give you this actually three definitions, three different words. You won't have time to write them all down, but they're there on the website. If you do Facebook, you do Facebook. If you do YouTube, you can go to YouTube. You may have to wait a few days. You can go to the website. There's a transcript of every service that we do. So if you ever want to go back and just read it, sometimes I don't get it quite right because it's artificial intelligence and I'm not artificial. That's right. But artificial sometimes can't ma'am.Huh?

Oh, Amen. I knew I liked her. She's from the north, so I'm used, you know, in the north. They like to mess with you. Just a little bit of fun. So. Yeah. Yeah. For years, we moved from Michigan. I thought y'all are some rude people. I said no, or just our yeas or yeas and nays or nays. I just need an answer. Quick. You're taking me all around the mulberry bush, so to speak. So anyway, confinement. It means to keep someone or something within limits. Now remember, I don't even know where this is going at this point. I'm just looking up the word. He says, look up the word confine or confinement to keep someone or something within limits, to prevent someone or something from going beyond a particular limit.

Number three. To keep, to restrict. To enclose, to incarcerate, to hold captive, to imprison, to bind or to cage. Anybody want confinement in their life? Well, there's a lot of people there in some measure or degree that may not even know it. They might have got used to it. They might have adjusted their life to it. I think if we be, if we would be honest with ourselves, some level of confinement is working in all of our lives somewhere. In other words, is anything here? Have you ever felt imprisoned? Have you ever felt like there's limits all over your life? I can't do this.

And I can't do that. And I can't afford this. And I can't afford that. Uh, I can't my body. This, my health, this. My kids, this. My family with that. Well, all these are confinements. Then the next word he said, he said, look up definition. And I thought that I said, I said, Lord, would you say that again? He says, look up the word definition. And I said, okay, this would be the first time in my 40 years of life plus a little bit more that I've ever looked at the word definition. So here's what it means. It says what is meant by a word, concept or action to give meaning, to make something definite, to make it distinct, and to make it clear. Now get this to give meaning, to make something definite and make clear to describe the meaning of something. In other words, a definition explains through clarification what someone is trying to say with one or a few short words. So now I have that. Then he told me, he said, look up the opposite of confinement. In other words, I want a clear definition of the opposite. Here's what it means. Some of these are now some of these are verbs and, you know, synonyms and stuff like this but set at liberty. This is the opposite of confinement. Set it.

Liberty. Liberation. Freedom. We just got through singing about freedom. Unlimited. Unrestricted. Unrestrained. I like this one. Unshackled. You ever felt shackled. Unshackled. Unfettered. Acquitted. Released. Set free. Discharged. Loosened. Lose control. Gosh, you look like you have your control. Reveal, allow, increase. Exceed, promote, enlarge. Extend. Stretch. Widen. Expedite. Set at large. Having the ability to move freely. Release from constraints and limitations. That's the opposite of confinement. Anybody here like the opposite of confinement? Better than confinement. So this is where I was at this morning. I didn't have Isaiah 40 until later on the day. I just had these definitions. And then just as soon as I wrote this, thank God, the spirit of the Lord said, now go to Luke chapter four, and I'd like you to go with me to Luke chapter four in verses four through 18. A little context here. Jesus been in the wilderness not 40 days or four hours, not four days or 4 hours or 4 minutes, but 40 days. Tempted of the devil. He's in an astral body. He's tired, he's hungry, and there was no light on its quality in. He hadn't had any biscuits and gravy. No. And I know you know, no red eye gravy, no grits. Mhm. No. He had, he had fellowship with the Lord. That was better. But he's in a physical body. And so the devil comes to him. At the weak.

At the weak place. See? The enemy picks his time. The reason he picks his time is because one. He's a coward. That's the biggest thing. He's a coward. Two, he knows if you know who you are in Christ, he can't come out. He can't come at you head on because he can't win. You see, he knows he can't win. But you may not know that he can't win, but he knows it. So he never comes at you head on. Especially if you know who you are in Christ. Because even though he knows, as soon as you say something to him for this word, you're going to slap him in the next Thursday. If you wake up thinking, you know, what plan am I on? Hello. But Luke, chapter four. So we'll pick up the story here 14 through 18. So Jesus is dealt with him, the temptation, the the scriptures. The devil ended the temptation for a season. The angel showed up, ministered to him. He's fed. He's ministered to. He goes to the temple in verse 14 says, And Jesus returned in the power of the spirit, oh, he, he, he comes in here with power after 40 days, the power of the spirit. The power of who? Spirit. Spirit of the church. Down there at Shady Grove Methodist. No. He comes. He returned in the power of the what? The spirit unto Galilee.

And there went out of fame of him throughout all the region about. And he taught in the synagogue, being glorified of all. And he came to Jerusalem, where he had been brought up, and as his custom was, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read. And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Isaiah. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written, which is really interesting, because, you know, one, it's either his time to read or he asked to read. We don't we don't really know. I've read all different accounts, but I don't think if we need to know, he would have told us. But we know that he's the reader. And they delivered him the book of Isaiah, and it says he found the place where it was written. Now we know it wasn't in chapter verse like it is now, but but it was scrolls, right? And it's kind of big because Isaiah is a pretty large book in, you know, you know, when you when you think of other books in the Bible, 66 chapters and he doesn't have divided by chapters and verses. So he found the place. What what does he find it he's finding because he knows something's about to happen today. He knows there's some people being confined.

He know there's been people been set up in the trap? He knows. He knows that there's people that have reached their limits. He knows that there's people all around that's restricted, and they're as if they're incarcerated in prison and they're held captive. He knows that. But he knows his time has come now. And. He's going to speak of something concerning him. So he's looking in the scroll in Isaiah for a place that he knows they don't, but he knows this is speaking of him. That's right. Do you know when you read the Bible that you can find, even though your name may not be in there? I mean, I know my name's not in there. If it is, I never read it. Some of you have biblical names. But I. But I know that the Word of God is God speaking to me. I know that I'm in the family. How about you? Yes, I know that I'm a son of God, son and daughters of God. So it's always speaking to us. But here, here he says he found the place where it was written. And this is what he said. Um, if y'all got your Bible with, you know, I don't know if I'm in the King. Yeah, I'm in the king. James, you may have something different. Why don't you just read this with me? I'm. I'm in the King James.

But you do what you got. The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor. He has sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of the sight to the blind, and to set at liberty them that are bruised. Now the New Living Translation said this to set the oppressed free. So we know after he says that he hands it, but he hands the scroll back and he hands it to the minister. And he said today. And they looked at him like, I thought you through reading. Well, he's through reading the scroll, but he has a little something to add to it today. This scripture, these sayings are fulfilled in your ears. And they were so excited because they understood that what that what he was saying to them and who he thinks he is. Yeah. And if you go on to read it, we don't have time to go there. And it's not our it's not what we want to minister tonight. They were so excited. They took him to the cliff and tried to throw him off. That's right. And that's always worried me about being in the ministry. That's the reason I found some really flat ground, you know, right here. So anyway, I never wanted to be a church on the hill because I know I could be confrontational.

My personality already leans that way. So I'm not going anywhere on the bluff and building. No church. Church on the. No. I'm going to stay on low ground. Amen. So you could say. He unrolled the scroll and said, it's time to let the good times roll. Yeah, maybe that should have been my title. Yeah. He unrolled the scroll and said, let the good times roll. Verse 19, though it said. And he told them, he said, I'm here to tell you and to preach to you. This is this is the acceptable year of the Lord. It's the year of Jubilee. Now, I hope that you'll factor into this when I tell you I had no idea what I'm doing at this point. I mean, I mean, I just got three definitions. You know, when you're a minister and it's Wednesday night, you're looking. I mean, you're listening, but I have no idea what we're doing here. And I saw I got three definitions and he's building his own thing. So you can you can see how they connect, you know, with the definitions. Because, you know, we started off with confinement and then we, then we, then we defined define definition. And then he said, now look up the opposite of confinement. Well, you know, part of that part of that was to acquit, to unshackle and unrestrained and uh, uh, to, to set to set free, to set it large.

Well, he came to set the captive. What free now the passion translation and in verse only 18 and 19 says, the Spirit of the Lord is upon me. He has anointed me to be hope. Man, I like that. Amen. Amen. You know, it's one thing to have hope. It's another thing to have the anointing to to preach hope. Amen. Yeah. I mean, the anointing has no restrictions. It's the supernatural power of God, right? So you and I both, if you can read and if you believe we we have a mandate and we have the authority to preach this year of Jubilee. Well, you say, well, well, when's Jubilee? Well, now, in the New covenant. It's every day, man. I mean, well, we we don't have to wait 50 years. I'm not going to wait till I'm 50 years old. Oh, anyway. Uh, no. Or you have to wait for another 50 years. Not that that doesn't mean things. And it does biblically, but we're in the new covenant. Mhm. This this is the time that the, the, the free favor of God profusely abound. Every time that you read it, every time that you need it, every time that you're in a situation that you feel like you're confined, praise the Lord. In other words, if your life is not matching this book, which is all of us in different areas, then there are some area of confinement.

So just factor into the into this message tonight that. These weren't things. I looked up and built a sermon. He's talking about confinement. He says, what is the opposite of that? And what does he said? What does even definition mean? Does it mean anything? In other words, clearly he says, let's get clear about this. Wow. About ten minutes before I walked out the house and I walked in and out three times, I got this and I said, I'll be back. I forgot this, and and I got back. Now I hit the code, you know, and I locked the door and I got, you know, halfway to the truck. I was like, I forgot this. And I was like this. Anyway, no, no one's ever done that. I couldn't get my hair just right. But anyway, no, he said, tell the people not just for tonight. It's not about just this service. He said, tell the people, he said, he says, tell my people and this. And if you just go, well, we know that. He should tell my people, starting the moment they hear this, begin to believe me. This way he should tell them to expect the unexpected.

You say, well, I just got a situation and I get paid based on this. Well that's good. Because all that can change. Any. Everything in your life is subject to change. Say that we say everything is subject to change, subject to change. And I expect.

The next scripture I got was Isaiah 58 six. And verse 11, not 6 to 11, six and 11, and I'm reading both of them in different translations to the sixth verse is in the New Living Translation. Verse six says, it's not this kind of fasting that I've chose to loosen the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and to break every yoke. To break every yoke. Not not every other, not some, not 10% of them. To break every yoke. In other words, if the Lord was going to come visit you tomorrow, he might as well fix all your problems. I mean, how many of you say, Lord, I don't want to ask you for too much, just just do about 30% of why is in the room. I'm going to be really greedy and say, what do you need? So I'm going to say a thing. Robert Scales. You say everything I need, everything. I need everything, right? I mean, when blind Bartimaeus come, did he ask for one eye? Let me just give me one. I mean, the man is a gate. Beautiful. He just just give me one foot. I'll hop around on the other. Does he ask for that? No, he didn't ask for that. So we. So he said, uh, to set the captive free now and verse now, verse 11, ESV says, and the Lord will.

This is awesome. The Lord will guide you continually. This is Isaiah 58, verse 11 ESV translation says, and the Lord will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places. And he's going to make your bones strong. And you shall be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water whose waters do not fail. Now this is something you're receiving. But remember this. Remember, we read the spirit of the Lord is upon me. So this is something you're also imparting and giving. It's good to receive. You have to receive. Actually, usually you have to receive first before you can give out. You can't give what you don't have. If you put if you put me in a plane and I have to teach somebody else how to fly it, we're in trouble. I don't know how. I know you need to be at the front of the plane instead of the back, because the cockpit. And I don't know. And I think there's drinks back here in sprite in the back. But I can't help you past that. I don't know anything. Well, you know, no man or woman trapped and drowned in quicksand has ever pulled somebody else out of quicksand. At the same time, you can't help people like that. So we have to have help now. Isaiah 61, verses one through three says the Spirit of the sovereign, this is the new living. The spirit of the sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor, and sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, and to to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness the prisoners.

He's anointed us to proclaim good news to the poor. Sent me to bind up the brokenhearted. To proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness from the prisoners. Verse two. To proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. And this is Isaiah 61. This is what Jesus is proclaiming in Luke chapter. We know Luke chapter four to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor in the day of vengeance of our God, to to comfort all who mourn and provide for those who grieve in Zion, to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes. The oil of joy. Ha ha! The oil of joy. Well, I know they might have worked you today, but the oil of joy. Holy ghost, we need some oil changes right now. That. That ten minutes or less. We don't have ten. We only have ten minutes. Holy ghost, we need. We need the express Holy ghost oil change right now. He said instead of ashes, he says, you get a crown of beauty instead of ashes. Confinement. Opposite confinement. Yeah.

German was the oldest, and he, uh, he passed February the 6th, the day I was picking up reading the book. Uh, 2011. And so this man had so many miracles. Uh. I mean, profusely abounded. He had he had wild, crazy stories. I mean, uh, he he needed a certain car in a country that wasn't cars because of war, and he wanted a Chevrolet. And the guy said, well, we can make that happen.
